


HOW TO USE NEIGHBOURHOOD STATISTICS

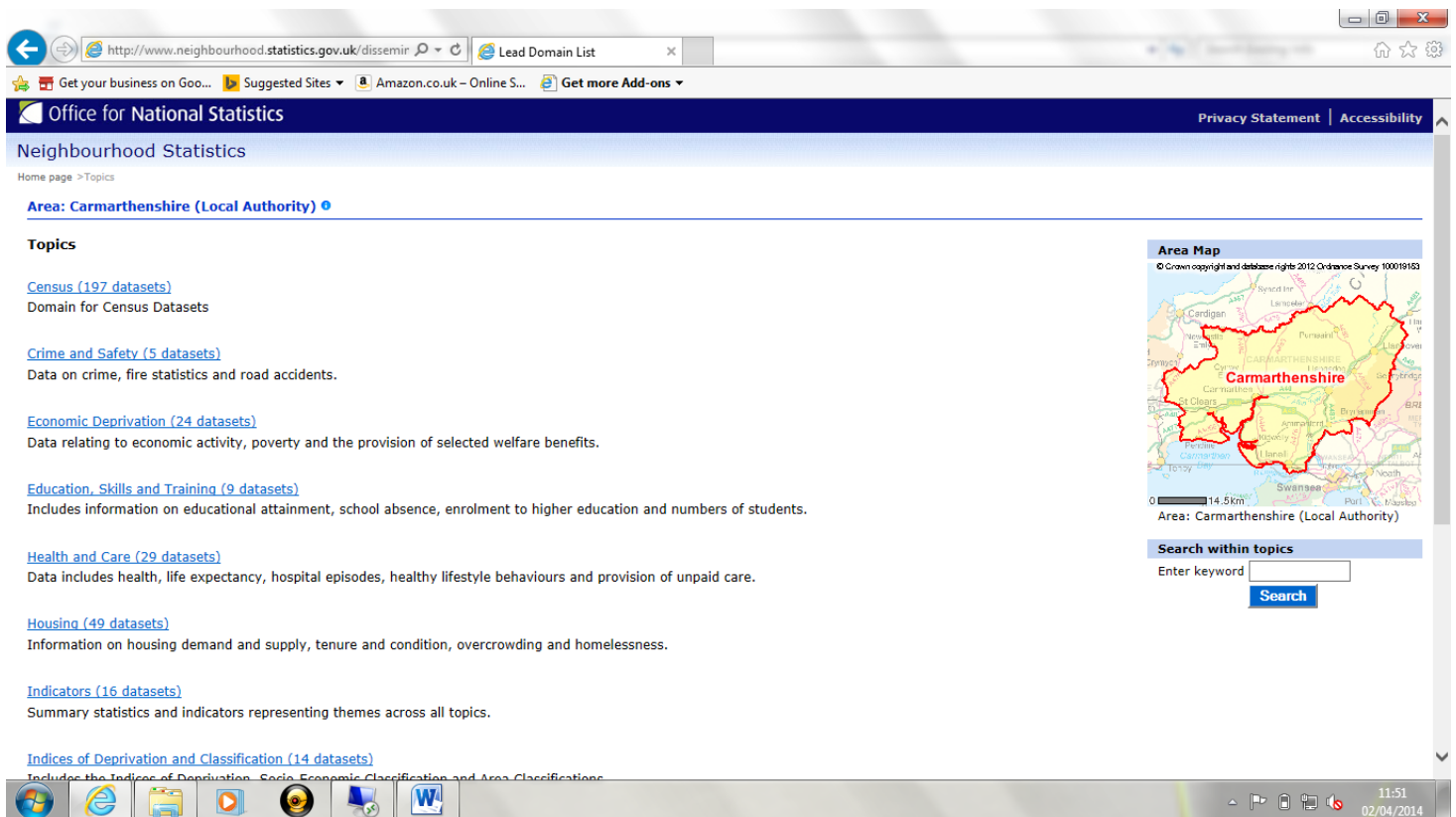
1. When directed to Neighbourhood Statistics home page you can either navigate to “find statistics for an area” or select “neighbourhood summary”. For both type of research you will need to provide a postcode of the area you are interested in gaining data for.

If you have selected to “Find statistics for an area” you will need to select from the categories provided the type of area you need statistics for.




